

Two Weeks Remain for Municipalities to Submit Applications for Brownfields Redevelopment Funds

The Connecticut Department of Economic and Community Development (“DECD”) is accepting applications until April 14th for its newest round of grants, for a total of up to \$7.5 million, to help remediate and redevelop brownfield sites throughout Connecticut. Eligible applicants, including municipalities and economic development agencies, may request up to \$2 million for remediation projects and up to \$200,000 for assessment projects. Funds may be used to assess, investigate, remediate and develop brownfields, including professional fees associated with redevelopment, such as attorney’s fees.
