James participates in mediation programs for all courts and is called upon to accept fiduciary appointments in probate matters.

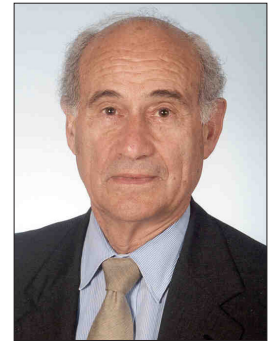
